Friends in Christ,

As we work our way through the book “Real Faith for Real Life, Living the Marks of Discipleship” several things have struck me. Many congregations end up spending way too much time on the things that don’t matter to our faith and not nearly enough time on the essentials of faith. In his book, Michael Foss explores the six building blocks of faith; daily prayer, weekly worship, Bible reading, serving others, faith nurturing relationships, and a generous spirit. These might sound like simple things to do but making them a priority in our lives can be challenging.

Throughout the book he offers examples and even different approaches and options for these marks of discipleship. It strikes me that most of what he does throughout the book is to give his reader as many ways as possible to connect with God. Take prayer for instance. Foss goes through a number of types of prayer, some I do not use regularly because I don’t find them to be overly effective for me. But they are effective forms of prayer for others.

What I’m saying is that faith is not an equation or scientific fact where there is only one right answer or one correct way to go about it. Growing in our faith is about knowing yourself and how you connect with God. For any of these “marks” to make a difference in our lives one thing is true; God and our relationship with him must be a priority in our lives and in our community of faith.

In our conversation about the book, what I have enjoyed most is hearing how each mark of discipleship is experienced by each individual. Our conversation has been rich and meaningful, and I believe that is part of what draws us together as a community in Christ; meaningful conversation about faith.

So, as the summer draws to a close, all too soon I might add, I want to invite you to consider how you are being fed. What are you choosing to make a priority for your own faith life? Take those marks of discipleship I mentioned at the beginning of this letter and make a meaningful stride to engage in those practices more. We need you to be fully engaged so we can best be the body of Christ that we are called to be. But we each need to continue to grow in our relationship with God for our own faith lives. If you need some help or conversation in order to figure out how to take that next step, let’s talk.

TSLC COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS JULY 11, 2023



Newsletter Summary -

Finance Committee Update – June 2023 income was \$30,939; down from May, 2023 and also less than June of 2022. Although we typically see a decrease in giving in the summer, this will need to be watched and a reminder sent to members stressing the importance of continued giving even when vacationing and not in attendance. Also noted that lighting improvements (Fetrow Electric) have begun in the West Wing. A motion was made to use an additional \$4,800 from Capital Improvements for steeple removal.

Materials have been mailed to all congregation members for the special Congregational Meeting to be held on August 20, 2023, following the worship service. This mailing also includes notice of the date for the November Congregational Meeting.

Council members are working on a Committee Policies/Procedure Handbook. Conversation is also continuing on the Rostered Leader Sabbatical Leave Policy with a vote expected in August.

A decision was made to change the October Council meeting date to the 1st Tuesday of the month (October 3, 2023) due to a conflict with Mechanicsburg's Halloween parade.

Vacation Bible School RECAP

Everyone had an awesome week at Vacation Bible School, July 17-21! There were 38 children who learned a Bible story, made a craft, played games, and visited with a different mission organization each night. At the mission's station children learned about Families United, Lutheran World Relief, home visitation, Dog T.A.G.S, and Operation Warm Hearts. Our children and adults gave generously this year. We collected \$962.12, which will go toward supporting our missions' focus. The adult class studied the creeds of the Lutheran Church and was well attended with over 24 people. It takes many people each night of VBS to run the program; this year we had over 60 volunteers, including 10 of our youth. The volunteers did everything from painting sets, decorating, teaching, leading small groups, moving a 300lb bounce house, singing in worship band and generally anything that was asked of them. Our kitchen staff served over 500 dinners and snacks. Danielle Erdley, Deb Smith and I would like to thank the many people who volunteered in various ways and to the many congregational members who donated items for our LWR health kits, snacks, and ice cream. Through our summer book study, social media posts, spending time as a congregation reading Proverbs together, and other activities, we have had the chance to explore and practice the 6 marks of discipleship outlined in Michael Foss' book, "Real Faith for Real Life." Throughout the month of August we will continue to offer opportunities to learn about and practice these marks of discipleship: Daily Prayer, Bible Reading, Weekly Worship, Christian Service, Relationships that encourage spiritual growth, and giving in the spirit of generosity. We encourage you to take advantage of any and all ways of learning and growing that are meaningful to you, and challenge you to step outside your comfort zone and try to grow in an area that might be challenging for you.

Daily Prayer

How would you like to increase or strengthen your prayer life this summer? We encourage you to check out prayer resources available in the church narthex. We also encourage you to take your bulletins home each week and spend a little bit of time each day praying for those on our community prayer list. If you would like to join our congregational prayer chain, please contact Linda Yohn. One idea we offer to enhance your prayer life is to keep a prayer journal—write down those people or situations you are praying for, and take time every month to look back on it and see how God has worked through your prayers and the prayers of others in those people's lives and situations. Look for more ideas to help your prayer life on our church social media accounts in the month of August.

Weekly Worship:

The staff hears all the time about how much people love our one-service Sundays during the summer, as they get to see friends they have missed from attending different services and share in worship and study with their entire church family! We feel the same way and want to see you every week you are in town! But we also know that summers are a time for travelling and exploring new places, visiting family, and taking some time to relax. Some of you will join us from far off places through our livestream. Some of you will join family in their home congregations. And some of you will brave being visitors in an unknown church. We invite you to share these experiences with us! Each Monday we will post on social media asking those of you who worshipped elsewhere that past weekend to share something with us—take a picture, tell us a story, whatever you like! We want to know where your travels take you and how God met you there!

Relationships that Encourage Spiritual Growth: GROWING AS DISCIPLES IN OUR FAMILIES

TSLC offers so many ways to connect with others in our faith families. We encourage this summer to make this a priority—take part in one of the many activities the fellowship committee has planned, volunteer for a new group or committee to meet new people, or even just reach out to someone you don't know as well in our congregation and see if they would like to get dinner. Nurturing relationships with people who share our faith is crucial to our growth as disciples.

Parents are the first ones to teach their children about following Jesus, and we strive to help them do that. Almost all of the things mentioned in this article can be incorporated into your family life. To help you do that, each Wednesday we will be posting on Facebook activities for families that correlate to one of these marks of discipleship. Giving in the Spirit of Generosity

With summer travels comes being gone from your home congregation. Please remember to continue your regular offering through the summer months, so that TSLC can continue to do its important ministry. We ask you to consider a way in which your family can give of their time, talents, and treasures in a new way this summer. Look for ideas in August social media posts!

Christian Service—TSLC SERVICE BLITZ AUGUST 13!

Have you marked your calendar yet? **Sunday, August 13**, following worship we will join together as a congregation to serve our community. We have five options for serving others in our community that day, and we hope that all TSLC members will take advantage of one of them! The options are:

1. **Baking Cookies for Families United:** Families United is a Pennsylvania state-wide non-profit that serves over 500 children. They assist in placing children in quality foster homes and supporting them and their foster families, helping families adopt children both domestically and internationally who would otherwise be in foster care, and runs residential homes to those transitioning out of foster care. A Families United representative shared their work with this year's VBS participants and they encouraged us to continue to support this organization. Families United has a large fundraiser coming up and needs desserts donated for the event, so a group will gather in the TSLC kitchen to bake cookies for their use.
2. **Making Blankets for Operation Warm Hearts:** Operation Warm Hearts, a non-profit began and run by TSLC member Emily Gochenaur, works with many local non-profits to make sure those in need are kept warm and know they are cared about, often through the donation of knitted items. Operation Warm Hearts has their annual blanket drive coming up in September, and are still quite a ways from their goal. Join others in the TSLC Fellowship Hall to tie or knit blankets to help them make sure all in our community are kept warm this winter.
3. **TSLC Cemetery Clean-Up:** If you've been in the TSLC cemetery lately, you know it could use some extra care. Gravestones are turned over, many need to be cleaned, there is weeding and other landscaping things that need to be done so that those coming to visit loved ones grave have a place of respite and calm in which to do so. Join others in helping to make the TSLC cemetery a little more welcoming.
4. **Church Road Clean-Up:** Church Road leads right to our church building, and is often littered with garbage, construction waste, etc. It is important to take care of the world God created. Join others in helping to clean up Church Street for our community.
5. **Work at LaunchPad's transitional home:** LaunchPad is a non-profit organization that offers a safe place to live, education assistance, and vocational training to young men aging out of the foster care system. They are in need of people to help power wash and pain their deck, do some window washing, install some trim, do a little decorating, and other various jobs depending on the volunteer's skill set. Join with others to help offer these young people a safe and welcoming place to live.
*** This site is located in Newville, PA, so this group will have the longest time commitment due to travel time. LaunchPad will be providing us lunch while we are there.

We are so grateful.

What we have discovered over this past year is that in order to keep the concert series going and financially independent (not relying on TSLC budgetary funds or continued memorial gifts), we will need to have other income sources other than just the free will offerings taken at concerts. We will be beginning a sponsorship program where individuals and/or businesses are able to make a yearly donation towards the concert series. These sponsors will be recognized in each concert's program and will have other perks as well—that are yet to be determined. Music Notes

Association of Lutheran Church Musician National Conference Re-Cap

The Association of Lutheran Church Musicians, otherwise known as ALCM, is a national service and professional organization whose primary goal is to nurture and equip musicians to serve and lead the church's song. They aim to do this by strengthening our Lutheran liturgical heritage, defining and supporting the role of the church musician (full-time and part-time), espousing professional standards, encouraging spiritual growth, fostering professional exchange, providing guidelines for employment, advocating college and seminary training in liturgy and music, and strengthening professional relationships between clergy and musicians.

I was privileged to attend the Biennial International Conference of ALCM in early July. It was a whirlwind of learning, networking, worship, and sharing the joys and struggles of being a church musician with friends old and new. I wanted to share just a few highlights with you:

* **Worship:** Each day began and ended with worship. We worshipped in some of Philadelphia's most historic churches. One of my favorites was Church of the Holy Trinity, located in Rittenhouse Square. This church is also known as the "O Little Town of Bethlehem" church, as it was the pastor and organist of this church, Phillip Brooks and Louis Redner respectively, that wrote this beloved carol in 1868. A beautiful mural depicting the carol is located in the Sanctuary.

We also were treated to a wide variety of worship styles and settings that spanned not just ELCA worship life, but Missouri Synod and Wisconsin Synod as well. We collectively found a lot of power in morning prayer led by Omaldo Perez and his worship team. Omaldo is known across the church music community for his amazing ability to take well known and loved hymns and set them in a different style or with different instrumentation to help hear them in a new way. Omaldo serves Grace Lutheran Church in LaGrange, IL, and publishes hymn arrangements and liturgical settings regularly.

* **Workshops:** Each day of the conference we had the opportunity to attend two different workshops on various topics. Luckily, we have the opportunity to watch the recordings of the ones we didn't get to attend after the fact as it was almost impossible to choose! Some of the workshops I did attend in person included one presented by Tom Shelton of Westminster Choir College and dealt with expanding the ways we minister to and include children in our worship music, and I was able to have some one-on-one discussion with him following the workshop on applying that to all ages. Another was given by the company Sweetwater on improving your livestream and ways to use that to expand your congregation's reach. Linda Borecki presented a great workshop on ways to incorporate new styles of music into your congregation without losing the beloved hymnody of our tradition. Lastly, Dr. Mark Oldenburg, who I know from our days from Gettysburg Seminary, presented on ways to faithfully recognize and celebrate civic celebrations within our church community. I am looking forward to sharing more with you about these and other workshops in the months ahead!

I am so thankful to the Personnel Committee and the Church Council for making attending this amazing conference a possibility. I look forward to using my newly gained insight to help deepen and strengthen the worship life here at TSLC!



For many people in our community, sudden homelessness is a reality. This is tragic, and even more so for those with families as most shelters split families up between multiple locations. Family Promise seeks to provide a safe place where families facing homelessness can remain together, receive the support they need, and work toward regaining independence. They do this by partnering with congregations to provide meals and lodging for the families each night.

August 20-27 is our third hosting week for 2023. We will need many volunteers to make this a success - from people to drive the Family Promise families to and from the Day Center on Erford Rd in Camp Hill, to those who will provide dinner for the families and those who will serve as overnight hosts. FAMILY PROMISE **IMPORTANT UPDATE**

The Family Promise Leadership Team wants to extend our thanks to so many of you who have supported this program over the years. We began our partnership with Family Promise in **late 2016** and continued on throughout the pandemic with meal support only, and then resumed on-site hosting, with our third week for 2023 coming up in mid-August. It's taken many, many people to make this program work; our estimate is about 30 people per week – and we couldn't have done it without you!

However, our personal situations have changed during that time and we are planning to step down at the end of this year. Along with that, we've lost several of our faithful volunteers (through moving away, health challenges or death) and it's getting harder and harder to find enough people to make the program work.

This upcoming August (20-27) week will be our last hosting dates for Trindle Spring.

This has not been an easy decision for any of us. Our plan is to continue to offer meal support a few weeks a year, but not to serve as a host site (or provide van drivers, etc.) if Family Promise will allow us to continue in this way. This is NOT an easy job and takes many hours of work, prior to each host week. For those of you who have worked with us in the past, you know that flexibility is key, and that many changes occur – even after the host week has begun and the guests have arrived.
