Friends in Christ,

On Ash Wednesday we began a journey of faith that will take us to the foot of the cross on Good Friday, and finish with us standing outside the empty tomb in amazement on Easter morning. During the remainder of Lent, we will gather for worship and fellowship on Wednesday evenings. We will read Lenten devotions and focus on our Lenten theme, "Again and Again." This theme reminds us of many things, but especially our need to return to God again and again, and the ways in which God comes to us again and again.

The season of Lent brings with it a certain amount of familiarity for many of us. We hear scripture texts that are well known to us, we know what to expect from our pattern of worship, and we even know where the story of Holy Week is headed. We've heard the story many times. It ends with the empty tomb and the reality of Resurrection.

However, we need to experience all the parts of this story in order for us to find the most meaning in it. In the context of Holy Week, the glory and celebration of Easter morning requires the celebratory entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. We need to feel the grief Jesus must have felt as he shared the last supper with his disciples. We need to understand the betrayal of Judas as he left the disciples that evening to hand Jesus over to the Jews. It is important to hear of Jesus' arrest, and even the anguish in his voice as he is nailed to the cross and lifted up to die by crucifixion. Then, before our Easter celebration, it is important to feel the darkness and seeming finality of Good Friday as Jesus is buried and the stone is rolled across the tomb. Holy Week runs the full spectrum of emotions, and it is important for us to go along with Jesus on that journey to the cross in order to better appreciate his sacrifice and God's love for us. Then we can break out in renewed song and joy on Easter morning as we celebrate that Jesus is alive and the tomb is empty.

With all that said, I want to invite you to join us for the services of Holy Week. Enter into this sacred story of God's love and salvation. In this newsletter you will find more details about the individual services and times. I hope you join with your church family "again and again" for the whole story of Holy Week.

May the story of Christ's Passion come alive for you anew this Holy Week.

Lent 2024 - "Again & Again"



In Lent, we're reminded that, again and again, suffering and brokenness find us. We doubt again, we lament again, we mess up again. And yet, in the midst of the motion blur chaos of our lives, God offers a sacred refrain: "I choose you, I love you, I will lead you to repair." Again and again, God breaks the cycle and offers us a new way forward. Join us this Lent as again and again, we bring all of who we are to God and trust that God will meet us, time and again, along the way.

Midweek Worship

Each Wednesday during Lent, beginning February 21st and ending March 27th, there will be an opportunity for a meal & time for fellowship and reflection. At 5:30pm, all are welcome to gather in the Fellowship Hall for a meal and conversation inspired by artwork that corresponds to that week's scripture reading. Then, at 7pm, we will gather in the Sanctuary for Holden Evening Prayer. Join us!

Congregational Prayer Wall Project

This Lent, we invite you to come to God in prayer again and again, weaving your prayers in with the prayers of your community to create a beautiful prayer wall. Woven together, your prayers will form the shape of an ampersand, representing God's holy "and." When we become weary from the chaos of our lives, God promises that there is always more to the story—death does not have the last word. When we feel helpless and hopeless, God's holy "and" encourages us to lift our weary eyes to search for more. This Lent, let us practice the power of 'and' as we sink into the repetition and ritual of prayer.

Adult Sunday School Offering - Preparing for End of Life

It is when we are grieving the loss of a loved one that we often turn to God, and plead for answers to why we must face grief and loss, again and again. And again and again, God meets us there, comforts us, and helps us to move forward. We trust and rely on this truth. But what about our loved ones when we are gone? One of the most loving things we can do for our loved ones is to make decisions about end of life matters before we are gone, instead of leaving them to deal with it in their grief.

Pastor Aaron and Pastor Martha will be facilitating a 4-week series during the Sunday School hour on preparing for end of life. Here is a little about what you can expect each week:

March 3 - Pastor Aaron and Pastor Martha will lead a discussion on how we, as Christians, talk and think about death and dying.

March 10 - Local attorney, Heather Royer, will join us to offer insights and answer questions about living wills, estates, power of attorney, and other necessary legal matters when preparing for end of life.

March 17 - Representatives from Malpezzi Funeral Home will be discussing how they work with families to make advance arrangements for funerals.

March 24 - Pastor Aaron and Pastor Martha will explain how they work with families and individuals in planning funeral services, and how you can make your wishes known in advance.

HOLY WEEK AT TSLC

Our Lenten journey has prepared us to remember Christ's death and resurrection. Please mark your calendars and plan to attend worship with your church family throughout Holy Week.

Palm Sunday: Worship at 8am and 10:30am, with 10:30am being livestreamed

We gather this Sunday with palms and prayers in the West Parking lot (weather permitting). After hearing of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem at the beginning of his final week, we process into the sanctuary with songs and shouts of Hosanna!

Maundy Thursday—Worship at 7pm, will be livestreamed

We will gather to remember Jesus' last meal with his disciples, giving thanks for the gift of Holy Communion. We will also hear his mandate to love one another, and reflect on God's great love for us shown through Jesus' death and resurrection. The service ends with the stripping of the altar accompanied by the chanting of Psalm 22, which reminds us of Jesus' arrest and how he was stripped of his robes and his dignity.

Good Friday Community Prayer Walk: 11am

We join with other Mechanicsburg congregations to pray for the needs in our community. There will be several starting points for the walk—Pastor Aaron will be leading a group that meets at Soldiers and Sailors Memorial Park. We will proceed from there, stopping along the way to pray for our community and the world. Our final destination will be the First Church of God, where we will gather with the rest of the prayer groups for a time of prayer and worship at 12pm to end the walk.

Good Friday Tenebrae Service: 7pm, will be livestreamed

Tenebrae is the Latin word for darkness, and the Tenebrae Service, or "Service of Shadows," is based on a 12th century service that is an extended meditation on the Passion of Jesus Christ. This service consists of readings, hymns, and eventual darkness, which is only illuminated by the Christ Candle, as we look ahead to Christ's resurrection.

Easter Sunday Sunrise Service: 6:30am

As the sun begins to rise on Easter Sunday, we gather in candlelight to hear the Easter Proclamation that Jesus is alive! The service continues with hymns, special music by the Chancel Choir and Bell Choir, the story of that first Easter morning, and the celebration of Holy Communion.

Easter Breakfast: 7:45-8:45am

Join your church family for a delicious breakfast! If you can help by baking muffins, set-up, serving or clean-up, please sign-up on the office bulletin board—many hands make light work!

Easter Festival Service: 9:15am, will be livestreamed

With full hearts and voices raised we celebrate that our Redeemer lives! This service will include the story of the first Easter, music by our Joyful Noise Choir and TSLC orchestra, and the celebration of Holy Communion.

GET CREATIVE WITH SCRIPTURE WORKSHOP

Saturday, March 16, 1-4pm we will be having a workshop to explore the ways we can be creative while learning and remembering scripture. You may have heard of it as "Bible Journaling" or "Creative Worship". This workshop is a way that anyone, (young or young at heart, male or female) can connect with God through using craft supplies to study the bible. You don't have to be artistic, have a bible that you want to write in or an art degree. You just have to spend time with others, creating, learning and spending time with God. Join us on Sunday, March 24, at 4pm for a concert by the Mansfield University Concert Choir. The Concert Choir is the premier touring ensemble of the university. Under the direction of Peggy Dettwiler, the group has achieved an impressive reputation of excellence, having been chosen to perform at conventions and festivals around the world. The choir has won top prizes in international competitions, including eight Gold Medals at the World Choir Games and four Gold Certificates at the Harmonie Festival. Most recently, the Concert Choir was awarded The American Prize for small college/university programs. The Concert Choir has performed in nineteen countries and produced twenty-three CD recordings. The singers are frequently praised for the emotional spectrum in their performances, their diverse vocal color, and their varied repertoire. Don't miss this amazing performance!

TSLC COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS FEBRUARY 20, 2024

- 1. Motion to have a congregational meeting Sunday March 3, 2024, for the purpose of asking for approval to spend up to \$6000 for the lighting project in the sanctuary.
- Noted from Parish Life that we are seeing 25%-30% increase in attendance. In December of 2022 = 159 and December 2023= 207 persons were served at Second Saturday. January 2022 = 174 and January 2024= 219 persons were served at Second Saturday.
- 3. The issue of refurbishing the bells has been tabled as the amount exceeds the \$5000 limit.


FROM THE TSLC QUILTERS


